As the ESCC reclaims its role as a unifying body for English-speaking Catholics in Greater Montreal, the Executive Director will bring to life a bold vision set by the Board—strengthening networks across ministries and parishes, reviving and implementing signature initiatives that foster connection and collaboration (such as an annual conference, retreats, webinars, and a digital hub), and ensuring financial sustainability through effective fundraising and outreach.

Key Responsibilities:

Leadership & Vision

- Provide strategic and operational leadership in alignment with ESCC's mission and renewed direction.
- Foster unity and alignment across the Board, staff, community partners, and the broader Catholic network.
- Serve as a visible, respected leader and spokesperson for the English-speaking Catholic community.

- Translate the Board's vision into goals, strategies, and measurable outcomes.
- Lead the development and execution of a digital platform and centralized communications hub.
- Re-establish ESCC-led events such as the Annual Catholic Community Conference, retreats, and community webinars.

- Oversee all program operations, ensuring timely delivery, impact measurement, and continuous improvement.
- Promote collaborative partnerships while leading uniquely ESCC initiatives that build identity and cohesion.
- Develop evaluation tools and indicators to assess program success and adapt to emerging needs.

- Build strong relationships with parishes, ministries, and the Catholic community.
- Act as a liaison with the Archdiocese, parishes and Catholic organizations to ensure representation and mutual support.

- Lead the design and implementation of a comprehensive fundraising strategy.
- Cultivate relationships with donors, philanthropists, and institutional funders.
- Manage and steward existing donors.

Communications & Public Relations

- Develop and implement a refreshed communications strategy, including newsletters and digital presence.
- Ensure ESCC's voice is present in diocesan, and public conversations affecting the English-Speaking Catholic community.
- Represent ESCC in public forums and key events.

Operations & Governance

- Prepare and manage annual budgets and financial reports in collaboration with the Board.
- Ensure strong internal systems for compliance, performance, and accountability.
- Supervise any staff and contractors, promoting a healthy, mission-driven organizational culture.
