New FRENCH translation of the Roman Missal:

Effective date and formation

The new translation of the Roman Missal will come into effect in Canada on November 28, 2021, the first Sunday of Advent. It will still be possible to use the current translation until March 6, 2022, the first Sunday of Lent; however, after that date, the new French translation of the Roman Missal will be mandatory in Canadian dioceses.

To help us discover and become familiar with this new translation of the Roman Missal, the members of the CCCB's Episcopal Commission for Liturgy and the Sacraments have organized its introduction in the French-speaking dioceses across the country. Bishop Louis Corriveau is in charge of this introduction process for the dioceses of the ecclesiastical provinces of Quebec, Montreal and Sherbrooke. He is leading a series of three virtual training sessions, the first of which has already taken place. Please click here to register.
