

**COMMUNIQUÉ No. 18 — September 10, 2020**  
**INFORMATION**  
**To Pastors, Pastoral Teams and Religious Communities**

Dear brothers and sisters,

As our fall pastoral activities slowly resume, we are faced with an upsurge in COVID-19 cases in Quebec. I wish to remind all of us **to continue full compliance** with the health directives. If you encounter difficulties or resistance in the implementation of these measures, the Diocesan Post-lockdown Committee and I are available to you to pursue the conversation.

**1. Information from the Diocesan Post-lockdown Committee**

**a. Poster for places of worship**

As announced, the government of Quebec and the Commission des Normes, de l'Équité, de la Santé et de la Sécurité du Travail (CNESST) jointly produced a poster for places of worship, titled: **CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) Preventive measures for safe places of worship.**

We ask that you **print and post** it at the entrance of every church. It bears the government logo and was produced specifically for places of worship. By posting it, you attest that your place of worship is in conformity with government requirements. This poster does not replace the one produced by our diocese, <http://bit.ly/diocesanposter>, because the latter includes more specific information about Communion. Therefore, both posters must be visibly posted.

**b. Health protocol for the celebration of Confirmation**

## 2. Parish news

### a. Fall appointments

In recent days, Archbishop Lépine proceeded with new pastoral appointments, keeping in mind the common good, as well as the good of the parish communities and pastors. ### b. Return of pastoral and support personnel

Evangelization, education and accompaniment in the faith are more necessary now than ever before for the spiritual life and wellbeing of men and women everywhere. ### c. Hybrid pastoral outreach

At the initiative of the Office of Youth Ministry, the chancery is offering online formation on a hybrid and multidimensional pastoral approach, aimed at better responding to the social, cultural, spiritual and religious needs of young people. - Sunday, September 13, 2020: for the Church in the Holy Land (rescheduled from Good Friday by the Holy See)
- Sunday, September 27, 2020: for the needs of the Church in Canada
- Sunday, October 4, 2020: for the Pope's Pastoral Works (rescheduled from the Second Sunday of Easter by the Holy See)
- Sunday, October 18, 2020: World Mission Sunday
- For Development and Peace: parishes may take information from the organization's fall campaign to sensitize parishioners to donate online.

The list of collections for the diocesan church will be issued soon by the Service aux Fabriques. Thank you for giving what is possible at this time in solidarity with the universal Church.
