With this Exhibition, the young Blessed Carlo's intention was to bring attention to the power of the Eucharist and to Jesus' real presence in it.

About Carlo Acutis

Carlo Acutis was beatified in 2020, having died of leukemia at the age of 15. Showing remarkable courage and great faith during the course of his illness, he felt profoundly drawn to the Eucharistic miracles. As a result, he designed an exhibition of miracles that had occurred on five continents. This Exhibition is now touring the world.

He loved video games, football and working on computers, but his greatest attraction was to Jesus' presence in the Eucharist.

In 2002, he began his project of creating an exhibition to feature the most important of the Eucharistic miracles. The project, which also came to involve his family members, took two and a half years to accomplish.

Carlo said that, "when we face the Eucharist, we become holy;" and that "to always be close to Jesus" was his life plan.
