Following Christ's example, the permanent deacon serves the Church in three distinct ways:

Service of the Word: proclaiming the Gospel and commentaries during the Mass;

Service of the Liturgy: assisting the priest, celebrating certain sacraments;

Service of Charity: performance of good works in the service of the Christian community and of society.

The deacon may be a married man and may have children and full-time or part-time work in society.

Because of the nature of his vocation to the Church's service, the permanent deacon is chosen and ordained by the bishop of his diocese. Following his ordination, the deacon receives an appointment (assignment) authorizing him to serve in a particular Christian community.



Let our prayer of Thanksgiving go with them as candidates and with their wives, their children and families, as well as the greater diaconal family of Montreal!
