

**COMMUNIQUÉ no. 32 – March 4, 2021**  
**INFORMATION**  
**To pastors, teams and religious communities**

Brothers and sisters, as we persevere in this challenging Lenten season, let our focus be on Christ, our only hope. The following are some reminders, instructions and suggestions to share via your various networks:

**1. Reminders and instructions:**

**A. You can make your voice heard** and invite your parishioners to do the same, proposing that the limit of participants at a celebration be set at **30% of the usual capacity** of the given place of worship.

**B. Baptisms of small children and weddings:** in anticipation of a celebration in the coming months, requests and reservations can be accepted with qualifications. For the moment it is still not possible to celebrate baptisms and weddings in the red zone.

**C.** Like all pastoral workers, we can feel **Holy Week and the Easter Triduum** fast approaching. Subsequent to the latest announcements by the public authorities, we have good reason to believe that, by the end of March, government health guidelines will have changed for the better. At the present time, however, it is still difficult to determine what will or will not be possible in our parishes for Palm Sunday and Holy Week.

- a. One thing is certain: by mid-March, I will convey the applicable liturgical instructions to you, even if that means presenting several scenarios, depending on the circumstances at that time.
- b. Now that the churches are open, it will be possible to carry out a form of blessing and distribution of the palm leaves, in compliance with health measures.
- c. We encourage you to share your ideas for celebrations during Holy Week : the Palm Sunday, the Chrism Mass and the Easter Triduum. Your proposals in this regard are most welcome: [vg@diocesemontreal.org](mailto:vg@diocesemontreal.org). We will be sharing them with everyone in the coming weeks.

**D.** Reminder to members of the **local "deconfinement" committees**: weekly meetings are to resume Tuesday, March 9, from 12:30 to 1:30 pm.

**2. 24 hours for the Lord: March 12 and 13, 2021**

The Pontifical Council for the Promotion of the New Evangelization has sent a [suggestion-guide](#) in preparation for the activities of *24 Hours for the Lord* to take place March 12 and 13, 2021. This year's theme is "Who forgives all your iniquity" (*Psalms 103 (102):3*).

Since its inauguration in 2014, *24 Hours for the Lord* has been an annual worldwide Lenten event, traditionally held on the Friday and Saturday preceding the fourth Sunday of Lent and calling on us to accept God's mercy through Eucharistic Adoration and the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Given the preventive measures and precautions in place on account of the pandemic, each parish must decide how to observe this event, in person or online.

### 4. Online Scripture-sharing Groups (only in French)

Would you like to offer your parishioners a user-friendly catechetical approach for adults to help them deepen their knowledge of the Scriptures? The *Catéchèse biblique de la liturgie dominicale de la Parole de Dieu* initiative is the answer!

This program is easy to set up, is suitable for remote meetings via videoconferencing platform and permits the creation of small, independent groups. The concept was developed by Yves Guérette - priest for the diocese of Quebec and professor at the Faculty of Theology and Religious Sciences at Université Laval - with the support of Novalis.

Yves Guérette offers an initial **training session of 90 minutes on Thursday, March 11, from 7:00 to 8:30 pm**. The session is free of charge and will be accessible by videoconference.
