

COMMUNIQUÉ No. 24 — December 17, 2020 INFORMATION To Pastors, Pastoral Teams and Religious Communities

Dear Brothers and Sisters, we begin to see the great light of Christmas breaking... and a smaller light at the end of the pandemic tunnel. The following guidelines, reminders and indications will help us 'make it through:`

1. A sign of solidarity: Christmas bells

Our Archbishop encourages the parishes and chapels in the Diocese, where possible, to ring the bells in their places of worship on December 24th at 6:00 p.m., to signal the joy of Christmas reaching out to all our fellow citizens.

2. Directives for the Advent – Christmas Season

a) In accordance with a decree received yesterday from the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, priests may celebrate as many as four Eucharistic celebrations on the Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord, the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, and the Solemnity of the Epiphany in this time of pandemic.

b) Reminder concerning essential guidelines

- According to our understanding, the announcement by the Government maintains the guidelines already in effect for our liturgical celebrations in the red zone. The guidelines will remain in effect until further notice, stipulating a maximum of 25 participants in the congregation (each family member counting as one participant), not including those leading the liturgical celebration.
- Regarding those **leading the liturgical celebration**: please limit as far as possible the number of those involved. For instance, allow one family but not two into the sanctuary in order to perform the reading and altar service.
- With respect **to singing**, a small choir may be assembled, as long as distancing of 2 metres is observed separating singers from each other and from the congregation. Masks must be worn by the singers, and singing by the congregation is strictly prohibited.
- For the safety of all, we are advised **to avoid any gathering in groups** or engaging in conversations inside the church following celebrations.

c) Liturgical gatherings in residences of consecrated life

All liturgical gatherings and even the distribution of communion in religious residences where an outbreak has been identified are to be avoided until the lifting of restrictions is issued by local authorities in concert with public health bodies.

d) Sacraments for the sick in seniors' residences and CHSLDs

To the extent that local authorities allow, a priest whose health is not deemed to be 'at risk' may make himself available to celebrate the sacrament of the anointing of the sick. He must in these circumstances ensure that the guidelines for this celebration are followed: simplified ceremony, using cotton wool for the anointing.



e) Confirmations

The extraordinary faculties with respect to Confirmation of children and adults given to priests until December 13, 2020, have not been renewed for the time being. If a necessity arises, kindly contact the Chancery in order to obtain an *ad hoc* authorization: chancellerie@diocesemontreal.org.

f) Parish offices

The governmental guidelines respecting compulsory remote working for 'office employees' from December 17 does not directly affect parish reception services, according to our understanding. However, ensure that remote working is encouraged and that office meetings are by appointment only.

4. Microsite



a) Weekly meetings of local de-confinement committees

The Zoom meetings held weekly on Tuesdays from 12:30 to 1:30 p.m. for local de-confinement committees are temporarily suspended. They will resume in January, 2021.

b) Offices at 2000 closed
